Is your child always drawing or showing interest in how things are made? Maybe they are fascinated with the historic character of the building down the street or the composition of the skyscrapers around the city. Well, we have good news for you and that inquisitive student! Philadelphia Chapter of the National Organization of Minority Architects (PhilaNOMA) will celebrate diversity in architecture with our third annual summer program, C.A.M.P. Sustain.Ability. To us, CAMP means "Cultivating Architectural Minds through Mentoring Programs."

This unique program is targeted to students entering the 8th and 9th grades in September 2010 and considering future studies in architecture or related fields. This architecture discovery program aims to introduce students to numerous aspects of design and provide a preview of the various skills involved in the study of architecture. Students will create their own studio projects, interact with local architects, learn important architectural history and fun facts, and meet potential new friends. Over the course of the program students will be encouraged to formulate their own understanding of the field of architecture. Our goal is to foster diversity within the profession through greater awareness among younger students regarding the possibilities for and requirements of a design career.

This year, we are excited to have our program at the *University of Pennsylvania School of Design* in Philadelphia, PA. Workshops will be held at Meyerson Hall on UPenn's campus for two (2) consecutive Saturdays- **August 7 and 14**. Each session includes a full day of workshops from 9am to 3pm. This year, we are also pleased to note that participation in our camp is **FREE**- all instruction, architectural design tools and material supplies will be provided at no cost! However, parents should ensure their child brings a bag lunch each day.

# Information (1)

Welcome to PhilaNOMA's CAMP Sustain.Ability! These workshops are administered by Professionals in the Architecture field who are volunteering their services in order to provide enrichment and inspiration to our participants. We are very excited to have your students join us. Our goal is to provide them with a safe and enjoyable Saturday experience this summer. Please make sure all students come with the proper items and please be sure you have read/completed all of the information in this packet. **ALL mandatory forms must be returned to PhilaNOMA on or before July 1, 2010.**

## ***DROP-OFF/PICK-UP/SIGNING OUT***

Students should be dropped off and picked up inside of the University of Pennsylvania School of Design at Meyerson Hall. Directions to the university are enclosed within this packet.

The Volunteer Staff will meet students at the entrance for pick-up and drop-off of students. **Early drop-off begins at 8:30 AM and continues until 9:00 AM. Pick-up is promptly at 3:00 PM.**

**Authorized individuals can sign a student out each day if necessary. Volunteer Staff are required to I.D. all persons picking up students. Participants will not be released to anyone not on the Pick-up Authorization Form and without photo I.D.**

## ***LATE PARENT/GUARDIAN POLICY***

If a student is consistently picked-up late, they may be dismissed from camp. Please contact Karen Anderson at: 215-828-9862 if you know you will be late. The Volunteer Staff is never allowed to transport students home.

## ***PARTICIPANT'S BELONGINGS***

Please label ALL belongings. The University of Pennsylvania School of Design and/or the PhilaNOMA CAMP Sustain.Ability staff are not responsible for lost/stolen items. All personal belongings should be kept in a backpack.

## ***MEDICATIONS***

Medications in their original containers may accompany the student as long as the student provides an authorized letter from the parent or guardian authorizing use. Without this letter, the student will not be permitted to use these medications at the program.

## ***SICK/ILL STUDENTS***

If a student arrives with symptoms of illness including a temperature over 100 degrees, they will not be permitted to stay. All parents must pick up sick/ill students immediately. Please ensure that all participants are healthy before returning to CAMP.

**The Philadelphia Chapter of the National Organization of Minority Architects (PhilaNOMA) and the University of Pennsylvania School of Design does not provide medical insurance for students. In the event of illness or injury, Emergency Medical Authorities will be contacted and the parent and/or guardian will be notified.**

## **SNACKS/DRINKS**

**Parents are responsible for packing a bag lunch.** One snack will be provided by the PhilaNOMA staff each day. The snack will consist of chips, crackers, or a similar item. **No items containing either dairy or nuts will be provided.**

C.A.M.P. Sustainability will provide bottled water for students weekly. We ask that no additional snacks/drinks be brought (except for their bagged lunches) in order to insure safety and group cohesiveness. **If your child has special allergies or dietary needs, please note this on the application where indicated, and the Volunteer Staff will work with you to accommodate special needs.**

## **SUNSCREEN & LOTION APPLICATION**

Some activities may require going outdoors on the university campus. It may be necessary to provide students with sunscreen and insect repellent. The Volunteer Staff is not permitted to apply sunscreens or lotions. Students will be reminded of the possible need for sunscreen and/or insect repellent will remind student to do so before an outdoor activity.

## **BEHAVIOR MANAGEMENT AND DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS**

If a student intentionally harms others, vandalizes property, brings a weapon, or displays other extreme behavior, he/she will be dismissed from camp and no refund will be given. Staff is obligated to report any illegal behavior to necessary authorities. For inappropriate behavior, parents will be notified verbally and/or in writing with notification of further action. C.A.M.P. Sustainability reserves the right to immediately dismiss a student from the program.

## **CAMP STAFF WILL NEVER:**

- Use physical punishment
- Be verbally abusive
- Force, withhold or substitute food.
- Give any student the authority to punish another student.
- Place a student out of visual/hearing sight.

All students enrolled in PhilaNOMA's C.A.M.P. Sustainability must follow the **Rules of Conduct** including the following directions:

- Maintain personal care without staff support.
- Stay with assigned group.
- Respect others, listen, follow directions, and use appropriate language.
- Maintain self control, do not use physical force.

# rules of conduct

## Students must:

- A student fails to comply with the Rules of Conduct.

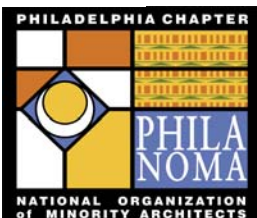

### DIRECTIONS

#### From the Northeast via the New Jersey Turnpike South

Use Exit 4. Bear right out of the toll following signs to Philadelphia and Ben Franklin Bridge. After crossing the bridge take I-676 West, to I-76 East, the Schuylkill Expressway. Follow I-76 East to 30th Street Station Exit. Turn right at the end of the exit ramp onto Arch Street. Follow Arch Street around and merge right onto John F Kennedy Blvd. Merge right onto Market Street. Turn left onto 34th Street to enter campus.

#### From the West via the Pennsylvania Turnpike

On the PA turnpike, use Exit 326, the Valley Forge Interchange. Take I-76 East for approximately 17 miles. Follow I-76 East to 30th Street Station Exit. Turn right at the end of the exit ramp onto Arch Street. Follow Arch Street around and merge right onto John F Kennedy Blvd. Merge right onto Market Street. Turn left onto 34th Street to enter campus.

#### From the North via I-95 South

Use the I-676/Center City Philadelphia Exit. Follow signs to I-676 West, the Vine Street Expressway. Take I-676 West until I-76 East, the Schuylkill Expressway. Follow I-76 East to 30th Street Station Exit. Turn right at the end of the exit ramp onto Arch Street. Follow Arch Street around and merge right onto John F Kennedy Blvd. Merge right onto Market Street. Turn left onto 34th Street to enter campus.

#### From the South via I-95 North

Use the I-676/Center City Philadelphia Exit which is approximately 7 miles north of the airport. Follow I-676 West, the Vine Street Expressway, until I-76 East, the Schuylkill Expressway. Follow I-76 East to 30th Street Station Exit. Turn right at the end of the exit ramp onto Arch Street. Follow Arch Street around and merge right onto John F Kennedy Blvd. Merge right onto Market Street. Turn left onto 34th Street to enter campus.

#### From I-76 West

Follow I-76 West to the 30th Street Station Exit. Make a left at Market Street. Take Market Street to 34th Street and turn left on 34th Street to enter campus.

#### From I-76 East

Follow I-76 East to 30th Street Station Exit. Turn right at the end of the exit ramp onto Arch Street. Follow Arch Street around and merge right onto John F Kennedy Blvd. Merge Right onto Market Street. Turn Left onto 34th Street to enter campus.

#### From South Street, East of the Schuylkill River (non-highway route)

Take South Street to 22nd Street. Turn onto 22nd Street and continue to Walnut. Turn left onto Walnut Street and continue to 34th Street to enter campus. To continue back onto South Street, make a left turn onto 34th Street until you reach South Street.
